

WEEKLY TIMETABLE – MASTER IN ECONOMICS – UNIVERSITY OF COPENHAGEN

Example of a weekly timetable for a Master's degree student (*indicative- find your courses at <https://kurser.ku.dk/>*)

- The courses [Econometrics II](#), [Micro III](#) and [Macro III](#) are mandatory during the first semester. If one or more of these courses are included in the bachelor's degree, students can replace these courses with elective courses.
- All students must have two seminars (typically during 2nd or 3rd semester). There will typically be some lectures / meetings at the beginning of the semester. After an individual writing period, there will workshops with presentations at the end of the semester.
- The Master's thesis must be written at 3rd or 4th semester. There will be a thesis seminar prior in the beginning of the process. Meetings with supervisor are arranged individually.

The weekly timetable below is based on 4 elective courses for a total of 30 ECTS. Basis for calculation:

30 ECTS credits distributed over the 14 weeks of teaching and 5 weeks for exams and exam preparation provides a workload of approximately 43 hours a week. The student is expected to spend an average of 25 hours per week on preparation and group work, distributed on weekdays and weekends.
